Dear Parents,

You will recall in the last five newsletters that I included summaries of the first five habits of "Seven Habits of Highly Effective Families" (Stephen Covey).

Habit # 6: - "Synergise" (summary of 28 pages ... THIS IS DEFINITELY MY FAVOURITE CHAPTER!)

"Synergy is the 'summum bonum' (supreme or highest fruit) of all the habits. It's the magic that happens when one plus one equals three - or more" ... We might think of synergy as a third person in our relationship ... Synergy is "risky business" because it involves stepping out into the unknown and the process of creating it can sometimes be near chaos ... "You go in not knowing what's going to come out of it, but knowing that's it's going to be a lot better than anything you brought to it" ... It's an adventure and the magic of it is in the "moment of mutual vulnerability".

HOW CAN WE CREATE SYNERGY IN OUR RELATIONSHIP?

Learn to value – even celebrate – "differences"

Wholeheartedly accept our partner / children for what / who they are – accept and love everything about them, not just the bits that are like our personality

Recognise "spouse differences" as being fabulous potential for reaching the "summum bonum"

Recognise that "synergy" unleashes a tremendous capacity to have fun and grow together in a respectful relationship

Remember: "The key to your family culture is how you treat the child that tests you the most" ... Powerful stuff!!!

Once we realise that each family problem is asking for a response instead of just triggering a reaction, we start to learn. We start to become a learning family.

"Priority Enrolment in Yr7 at St Pius X": (for families meeting criteria): OLD families need to be fully aware of the special “priority enrolment” in Yr 7 at St Pius X that OLD, specifically, is privileged to have. Essentially, families wishing to secure a Yr7 placement need to apply when their child is in Yr3 by the end of the month of May.

Importantly, our present Yr3 families need to apply in the coming weeks to secure enrolment for their sons in Yr7 2021. (Full details are on the St Pius X website).

Parents are encouraged to contact me at school if they would like more information regarding this important privilege for OLD families.

Enrolment Drive – Stage 3 2018: An enrolment drive is presently on at OLD for Yr5 and Yr6 2018. Parents are simply encouraged to “spread the word”!

ICLT Purchases – Update for Parents: I am pleased to inform parents that OLD has just finalised the order of a considerable number of computers for student learning. Staff are presently moving through extensive professional learning to ensure the new devices enhance learning in the best way possible.

For your information:

Years 5 and 6 will have 1:1 devices (Chrome Books) (ie each student will have their own device)

Years 3 and 4 will have 1:2 (Chrome Books) (ie one device between two students)

K,1,2 will have 1:2 (iPads)

Semester 1 Student Reports: Semester 1 student reports go home to families Friday 16 June.

Formal Parent / Teacher Interviews: These will be held in Weeks 9 and 10 this term (ie immediately after student reports go home)

'Pigeon Holes' for K and Yr1 Bags: These will be installed in the coming weeks.

Play Equipment after hours

Parents are respectfully reminded that the play equipment on the school grounds is out of bounds unless an OLD staff member or a Camp Australia staff member is supervising. Lunches delivered to the school office at OLD

Arrival times at school:

Parents are respectfully reminded that school commences at 8:45am. Students are strongly encouraged to be at school at least five or ten minutes before the 8:45am bell so they get a chance to link up with their peers and get settled. Students regularly arriving late to school are missing valuable learning time, and they arrive not having valuable before-school socialising.

Students arriving after 8:45am need to go to the school office for a late note. This procedure is a Catholic Schools Office expectation. Thank you for your anticipated co-operation regarding this matter.

Uniforms

A school uniform is a very important part of being a member of the OLD family. It is a symbol to the wider community of what family we belong to and is a sign of the pride we feel towards ourselves and our school. As we have now transitioned into wearing our winter uniform, I would like to remind the community of some uniform guidelines.

- Each day children should arrive to school looking neat and tidy; shoes regularly polished and uniforms regularly cleaned and ironed.
- Boys must tuck their shirts into their pants and wear school ties. Just like tying shoe laces, teaching a child how to properly knot their tie can be a challenge, but it also a life skill they will develop, so we appreciate the parents and guardians who are taking the time to do so and encourage all others to attempt to do so too. (Don't forget that pre-tied, strap-around ties are also an option)
- Girls must wear navy or dark blue ribbon or hair ties and keep all shoulder length hair tied up away from their face.
- The school hat is also an important part of the school uniform and essential in protecting our children against the harsh Australian sun. Every day of the year, children must wear their school hat whenever they are outside (before school, recess, lunch, during sport and after school). The teachers will be enforcing this and if children do not have their hat they must stay in the shade. Children will also not be allowed to go to Beauchump Park without a hat.
- This is also the time of year when our lost property bins overflow, as children take on and off layers throughout the day. Please label all items of clothing clearly with your child's name and talk to your children about being responsible for their belongings.

On behalf of all the teachers, I thank you for working with us to educate your children about taking pride in their uniforms and being responsible for their belongings.
