Dear Parents and Friends,

Kindergarten Orientation Session 1 of 3 – Tomorrow:

Special Invitation to a “Thank You Morning Tea” for Parent Helpers of 2018:

Parents are warmly invited to attend a special “Thank You Morning Tea” for parent/friend helpers of 2017 on Friday 1 December 8:45am in The COLA – (Hosted by the school).

Survey for Parents to Complete – Regarding a proposed fundraising levy:

Thank you to all families who have responded to the ‘Monkey Survey’ regarding the proposed introduction of a \$120 annual ‘per family’ levy in place of fundraising at OLD. This was emailed to all families last week. If you missed the email, please refer to the following:

- Presently, parents and friends organise various fundraising events during the year (eg the Sports-a-thon, The Disco, Mothers’ Day Stall etc) and the total amount raised each year is usually around \$20,000 to \$25,000.
- If a \$120 annual ‘per family’ levy is introduced, it would raise about \$25,000 each year - (I note that it would be a non-compulsory levy that importantly relies on the good will of our parent body)
- As per usual, during each year, the P+F would work with the school to determine what the raised funds would be directed towards for the students - (eg this year, \$21,000 was spent directly on the new synthetic grass on the top area of the school grounds – Thank you!)
- If the levy is adopted, we can still have the exciting events like the Sports-a-thon, but we’d have to classify the Sports-a-thon a ‘fun-raising’ event, not a fund-raising event!
- If more than 65% of families vote “YES”, there will be no fundraising in 2018 and subsequent years. I note that parents will still need to pay for social events like the disco etc, but they will be run ‘not for profit’. I also note that there will be a couple of days in the year when students will be asked to voluntarily bring in a gold coin for ‘missionary’ / ‘needy’ causes like ‘Mission Australia’
- Finally, many Catholic Primary Schools have now adopted a fundraising levy strategy, and this survey process is approved by the Catholic Schools Office.

At Cana Farm, people have the opportunity to learn and work in a supportive, caring environment.

The word "Cana" is taken from the biblical story of the Wedding Feast at Cana. Central to the vision of Cana Communities is the idea that everyone's life deserves to be celebrated. Our focus is on the right of every human being to receive forgiveness and our choice is always for the person with the least options.
