


Senior Choir Performing Carols at Westfield Shopping Centre - Friday 1st December

The Principal's Piece - Cont.

Exciting Developments at OLD in the narrow strip of land that fronts Ferguson Lane:

Parents might remember that OLD was recently successful in securing a 'Club Community Grant' where our school was awarded \$22k in funds to build and maintain a fantastic community garden. This will result in a number of benefits including a significant lift to the external appearance of the school, and a wealth of learning opportunities for our students.

Grants such as these are increasingly important as we strive to maximise improvements to our school while we minimise any financial outlay from parents. I am now pleased to share this progress report.

Firstly, I sincerely thank Rob Loughman (Jennifer KB) for the enormous commitment he's made to providing plans and expert advice in the landscaping arena. I also thank the school staff for their contribution too ... And finally, I again thank Holly and Regina for securing the grant and providing advice and guidance along the way.

- In the coming school holidays, we will commence work on the Ferguson Lane garden by levelling the strip and turfing it with synthetic grass
- Following this, we will take delivery of about 14 substantial pots (I note that some of these pots are slightly damaged and need a paint lift ... this will hopefully be done by parents at a working bee in early 2018)
- A watering system will be installed
- Up-lighting will be installed
- Seating will be installed
- Stage 3 (ie Yrs 5 and 6) 2018 will have an important leadership role in managing this garden and developing it too

Infants Road Safety days (Week 10)

Following on from the Road Safety play the children watched at Mercy College last week, all the children in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 will be involved in a bike/scooter safety lesson at school. We will be inviting the students to bring in their bikes and scooters to school (helmets are compulsory). If your child does not have a bike or scooter or is unable to ride one, it is ok, we can either share or give them other fun jobs during the day.

During the lesson students will learn about road signs, how to cross at zebra crossings and lights and how to ride safely on footpaths. They will also complete a fun obstacle course. The sessions will involve practical lessons in the playground and theoretical lessons in the classroom.

When students arrive at school, all bikes and scooters will be 'parked' in a special OLD parking area in the playground (valet parking will be unavailable). ☺

Students wear sports uniform on their bike/scooter safety day.

Please see below which days each class will be doing the bike safety lesson (Your child only needs to bring in their bike/scooter and helmet on the designated day below):

Monday 11th December: Year 2 (9-10.30; 2B 11.20-12.30; 2G)

Tuesday 12th December: Kindergarten (9-10.30; KB 11.20-12.30; KG)

Wednesday 13th December: Year 1 (9-10.30; 1B 11.20-12.30; 1G)

Our day will be an even bigger success with some helpers, so if you would like to help during these days please let Miss Thorpe know via email. Fingers crossed the weather stays on our side too!

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL - (Cont.)

Walking line reminders:

We ask that parents who have children on walking line work in partnership with the teachers and remind their children of these important factors (we thank you in advance):

1. Mobile phones are not to be used while the children are on walking line
2. Students must walk to the correct destination and not change their mind without parent permission.
3. Students must walk in two lines up Ferguson Lane in a neat, orderly way as they are representing the school and must stay safe at all times
4. Walking line leaves school at 3.10pm; students must be seated under the music room by this time

Library borrowing:

Students must return ALL library books during Week 9. There is no borrowing of library books in Week 9 or 10 as the end of year stocktake begins during these weeks.



Home readers:

We ask that all families have a big search in their homes for any home readers. All home readers are to be returned to school by Wednesday 6th December. No home readers will be sent home after this date.

Ice-block purchases:

Starting this week and continuing into 2018 and beyond, students will only be permitted to purchase ONE ice-block each day. The parent volunteers in the canteen will also stop selling ice-blocks at 1.30pm (10 minutes before the end of the lunch), so students have sufficient time to finish eating their treats.

Advent begins on Sunday December 3rd this year. At our school assembly on the Wednesday the 29th of December, the school community will start getting into the spirit of Advent with the presentation of a special gift to the school from the Beram family. I wonder if you can guess what it is???

Year 1 Atrium Advent Visit

Over the past two weeks, Year 1 visited the Atrium for a special Advent visit lead by our wonderful volunteer pastoral associate, Angela Hague. The Atrium is a room where the children can come to be with God in an intimate, engaging and interactive way. It is a place that focuses on the child as an individual and encourages the children to respond to the Word of God in their own way.

Firstly, the children discussed what they saw on the prayer table and how these items help us to 'see' that Advent is a time of waiting to celebrate the birth of Jesus. The children delved deeper into this time of waiting and made connections between Advent and how the people of Israel waited hundreds of years for the Messiah. Angela spoke with the children about the prophets who gave the people hope for the 'light to shine in the darkness' and for the 'young woman – who would bear a son who would be God with us'. God sent these messages through the prophets to give 'clues' to the coming of Jesus.

Next, the children observed a demonstration of the parable of the Good Shepherd. The children were not told who the sheep and the Shepherd represent, rather the children were welcomed to discover for themselves, in their own time. The children were given freedom to respond in any way they wanted. Some chose to engage in Godly play with the materials, some chose to paint, while others chose to explore the maps of Israel. This was the most important part of the visit as the children were engaged in the environment and were free to choose the works that they were drawn to. In just a short time, the children began to make profound connections between the 'sheep' and the 'shepherd' and articulated how they are waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus.

Year 1 were extremely engaged throughout the Atrium visit which would not be made possible without our wonderful pastoral associate Angela. We look forward to visiting again!


SAMARITAN'S PURSE SHOEBOX UPDATE



