The Principal's Piece

Dear Parents and Friends,

The following article by Richard Rohr came across my desk last week, and I felt inspired to share it with readers during this Easter season. Interestingly, I got too caught-up in the Smith/Warner/Bancroft saga when the news broke, and I was guilty of harsh judgement. After reading the article following, I did a bit of a backflip.

Often the only thing that can break down our natural egocentricity is discovering that the qualities we might hate in others are actually within us. Indeed, we're not so moral after all. We've imagined doing 'bad' things; and if we could get away with it, we know we'd do it. Perhaps the only reason we don't is because we're afraid. Fear is not enlightenment. Fear is not the new transformed state of the risen Christ that we've been promised. Fear keeps us inside of a false order and will not allow any reordering.

Unless we somehow 'weep' over our own phoniness, hypocrisy, fear, and woundedness, we probably won't let go of 'the first half of life'. If we don't allow this needed disappointment to well up within us, if we surround our self with our orthodoxies and our certitudes and our belief that we're the best, frankly, we will stay in 'the first half of life' forever.

Many religious people never allow themselves to fall, while many "sinners" fall and rise again. Our greatest sin is not falling or failing, but refusing to rise and trust ourselves—and God—again.

We need to make sure we are always in need of mercy and we will never stop growing.

Richard Rohr's text so beautifully resonates with the School Principal of Our Lady of Dolours ... Sorry for all my shortcomings that I am now paradoxically proud of after mulling over the text above; text that can so beautifully inspire all of us to be transformed by The Risen Christ at this most special time of the year.

Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

Important note regarding students arriving at school before 8:15am

Parents are respectfully reminded that <u>no students are permitted at school before 8:15am</u>. This is a vital expectation, because a teacher goes on duty at 8:15am, and it is a significant safety concern if students are left unsupervised.

Thank you for your anticipated co-operation in this regard.

Your personal spiritual trainer: Someone who wants to develop their physical fitness might work with a personal trainer and develop an exercise program. Or join a sporting team or an exercise class. The same is true of people who want to develop their spiritual life. Do you want to pray in a way which is more than just saying words?

During April and May Fr Jim and Gail Gill will be offering people the opportunity to take part in the *First Spiritual Exercises* for four weeks. The *First Spiritual Exercises* draw on the 500 year old Jesuit tradition of prayer, updated and applied to contemporary living. It requires a commitment of 30 minutes of prayer for 5 days a week, with weekly facilitated small groups to reflect and discuss. No prior experience is needed. It begins with our own human experiences, and then builds each week to develop skills in prayer and discernment. All that is required is the willingness to pray. There will be several groups and most are already booked out, but there is a special one for school parents on Monday afternoons at 1.45pm prior to school pickup starting on April 30th, the first day of Term 2, and then for four weeks. Places are limited, so reply to jim@chatswoodparish.org.au if you'd like to take part.

Men: We sometimes feel like we're the only ones who struggle with marriage, parenting, career, health, and faith. We tend to be less verbal and vocal than women. We often struggle to articulate what's going in our hearts. But when there's a safe space to be quiet or to speak, we can often find a voice to speak our desires to be the best husbands, fathers, friends and men we can be. For the past year a group of men from our parish aged 21-70 have gathered for an opportunity to talk together as Catholic men about the things which matter in our lives as they did at the Men Alive Weekend. Now they want to join other men to join with them and Fr Jim, starting with a "Men's Mass" on 7pm this Wednesday 11th April. Maths games for the holidays

If you are looking for fun things for your family to do together in the holidays and will still like your child to practise some maths skills here are some fun games you can play...and all you need is a pack of playing cards!!! (Without the picture cards). Remember all these games can be changed to suit the age and developmental level of your child. To challenge your child even more with these games, use a stop watch and time them!!!

Game 1: Turning one card over at a time at a quick pace and your child says...

- The 'Friend of 10' (K-2)
- 1 more than this number / 1 less than this number (K-1)
- 10 more than this number (Yr 1-3)
- Double it (Yr 1-6)
- Halve it (Yr 2-6)
- Multiply by 2/5/10..or any timetable your child in primary classes are currently learning (Yr 3-6)

Game 2: Turning TWO cards over at a time, your child...

- Adds both numbers (Yr 1-3)
- Multiplies both numbers (Yr 3-6)
- Subtracts the smaller number form the larger number (Yr 1+)
- Makes the largest 2 digit number possible out of these two cards (Yr 1-2)

Game 3: Two players turn over TWO cards, your child...

- Makes the largest 4 digit number / smallest 4 digit number (Yr 2+)
- Adds both 2 digit numbers (mentally) (Yr 3+)
- Orders the 4 digits from smallest to largest (vice versa) (K-1)




