The Principal's Piece

Dear Parents and Friends,

This coming weekend is the feast of The Body and Blood of Christ.

Recently, in one of his homilies, Pope Francis spoke of Jesus as the living bread that can satisfy our deepest yearnings. "Besides physical hunger, people have another hunger, one that cannot be satisfied with ordinary food. It is the hunger for life, hunger for love (and) hunger for eternity," he said.

When reading Pope Francis' thoughts on 'hunger', I was reminded about a comment Mother Teresa made to a reporter when she was visiting Australia in the 1980s. Mother Teresa was asked, "How do you manage to cope with the abject poverty in Calcutta?" ... Mother Teresa's reply really stunned me in the 1980s when she said, "I find it so much harder to cope with the spiritual poverty here in Australia."

This weekend, we're invited to satisfy our spiritual hunger with the Eucharist at Mass on a very special feast day!

Whole School Review - next week at OLD:

Next week, OLD School will engage in the final stages of a Whole School Review. The last OLD Whole School Review was in 2012, so this is quite a significant event.

I sincerely thank the entire school staff at OLD for the dedicated work that's gone on in recent months to prepare for the review. We indeed have much to celebrate!

The School Review will take place on Tuesday 5/6 and Wednesday 6/6; several school principals and several Catholic Schools Office staff will visit us over the two days.

Towards the end of Term 4 last year, the Catholic School Office sent out an electronic survey to all our families inviting them to comment on the successes and effectiveness of OLD School. This data will be used by the School Review Team next week. I note that the Catholic Schools Office congratulated OLD School for having an outstanding number of surveys completed by parents; this will indeed make our data more accurate and relevant.

I also note that I have invited all class parent co-ordinators from all classes to attend a discussion forum with the School Review team on Tuesday 5/6 at 2.30pm. I have also invited a selection of 'others' in our community who are engaged in the myriad of activities that make OLD so special.
