 too. Additionally, structures will be set up to ensure 'student voice' is heard
 by the council.

- The OLD School Leadership Team, with the support of our Parish Priest, Fr Jim, will consider all applications and discern who ultimately will be on the Council. It is absolutely vital that all members are able to be impartial, objective and capable of representing the wider school and parish body of people; ie members are not on the Council to represent their own world-view. The group needs a wide variety of skill-sets, and people who come from varying 'walks of life'. We essentially need members to be 'of the people' and 'for the people'. Members need to be capable of networking effectively within the community, and they need to be people of action, not just 'advisors'. They must be focused on the OLD School Vision/Mission and the OLD Strategic Plan. Finally, and most importantly, they must have the student's learning and wellbeing at the centre of all decision making
- Because of the varied and weighty implications just listed, I trust readers can understand that an Advisory Council membership election process by the wider parent body could possibly gather a collection of members that won't satisfy all the critical requirements to ensure the best Advisory Council possible for OLD School

Will OLD still have a P+F Committee?

- After several discussions, including last week's P+F General Meeting, it is likely that a separate group to the Advisory Council will be required to help co-ordinate the various school activities we want to offer the children. Already we have an extremely well-oiled class parent co-ordinator system; so, with the formation of other sub-committees for specific projects as required, this broad group will likely execute a host of exciting initiatives year in and year out.
- One critical element for us to discuss, once again, towards the end of the year is a re-vote on the topic of a yearly fundraising levy (ie \$110 per family). We feel this is worthy of another vote because the outcome was close last time, and it occurred over a very unpredictable 'rising fees' climate which made some households feel a measure of financial uncertainty.
- If the parent body decides in favour of the levy, then our need to 'fundraise' throughout the year is alleviated, and our activities can be more focused on what everyone can participate in at very little cost or no cost whatsoever.
- Should we decide to keep things the way they are however, then the appointment of a group to facilitate fundraising (including a Treasurer to take financial account of funds) will be necessary from volunteers within the parent community.

And speaking of Treasurers ... Thank you, Katie and Katerina:

Thank you to Katie Crichton (Jasmine Y3, Benjamin Y1) and Katerina Planska (Frankie Y4, Kristof Y1) who were nominated as Co-Treasurers at last week's P+F General Meeting; and yes, they accepted!

Plenary Council 2020 and the Diocese of Broken Bay:

The weekend that passed 2 weeks ago (Pentecost – The Birthday of our Church) signified the commencement of something very special for the Catholic Church of Australia: (*PLENARY COUNCIL 2020—Listen to what the Spirit is saying*) - Pope Francis has approved the Australian Bishops' decision to hold a Plenary Council in Australia in 2020 and 2021. It is a significant moment for the Church in Australia to make decisions about the future. To prepare the agenda for the Plenary Council, all of God's people are invited to reflect on the question: "*What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?*"
