

Whole School Review – Summary Report from the Chair of the Review Panel, Miss Anne Duncan:

Last week, OLD School participated in the final stage of a comprehensive Whole School Review process, and the excellent summary report follows – (NB The previous major Whole School Review was in 2012).

Chair's Overview Report

The leadership team, staff and school community are to be congratulated on the reflective manner in which they engaged in the school review process. Panel members visited classrooms, spoke to students, parents, staff and the Parish Priest. It was evident that the whole school community was aware of their school improvement journey and was able to identify significant achievements and challenging future directions.

It was also evident to the panel that the School is engaged in a significant period of renewal. With the change in leadership of the School and Parish over the last eighteen months, there has been a reinvigorated approach towards school improvement. The new School vision (created 2017) of 'Ignite, Innovate and Include in Mercy' provides a strong foundation for future growth and improvement.

The range of strategies implemented since the School's last review were substantial. It was evident that these strategies resulted in improvements across the School. The panel affirms this work and commented that the School is now well placed to focus on assessing the level of impact any strategy implemented has on both student and teacher outcomes.

In conclusion, the directions, goals and suggested strategies outlined in the report strongly affirm the education being offered at the School.

On behalf of the panel I congratulate the Principal, leadership team and staff on the quality of the self-evaluation process. The panel particularly commends the quality of educational experiences offered by this school's highly professional and committed teachers. We thank the school staff, students and parents for the warm welcome and hospitality extended to us during the visit.

The panel leaves in the assurance that the School meets regulatory requirements and that the School is strengthening practice as a result of self-reflection and discernment and informed by the findings of the panel.



Time is running down for the Bishop's Art Competition. All students have been busily preparing their artworks for the school walk-through planned for NEXT Friday, Week 8 at 2:30pm. OLD Social Justice Initiative:

Refugee Sundays: June 17 & June 24

All items to school by Friday 22nd June: extended for one more week!

In partnership with the parish, the school community is going to be involved in supporting asylum seekers living in the local community and collect items for the 'House of Welcome.'

The House of Welcome's vision is for a society in which there is full recognition of the **dignity**, **equality**, **human rights and humanity of all p**eople living in the community no matter their age, gender, sexuality, nationality or religious affiliation, and no matter how they came to be in Australia.



They campaign with other asylum seeker organisations across Australia for **the right to work for all asylum seekers**, for an end to mandatory detention and for a nation of welcome and justice for all.

The 'House of Welcome' runs a Food Bank which supports people and families with limited or no income. They can access familiar and nutritious food which helps supplement a limited weekly budget.

Title: Action Required: Important Changes to the Qkr app

The Qkr team make continued updates to the app, so that it is more stable and easier to use for everyone.

The team is making some important changes to the Qkr app and in order to continue using Qkr, it's critical that you update to the latest version of the app in the Google Play store or Apple App store, as some older versions of the app will no longer be supported after the 6th of June 2018.

Android Users: Version 4.9.2 and older versions on Android will no longer be supported. (The Current version on Android is 4.9.3)

iOS users: on 5.3.2 and older versions on iOS will no longer be supported. (The current version on iOS is 5.3.3)

However, if you download the latest version of the app, you can continue to use as normal.


