A P+F organisation group that can meet prior to the end of this year to organise a full 2019 calendar of events

The calendar of events needs to have specific events allocated to specific grades

Standard structures/proformas can be agreed to to support ease of organisation

Each major grade event needs:

A leading co-ordinator

An 'events treasurer'

An engagement 'influencer'

A P+F organisation group to effectively oversee all events; but this group does not necessarily have involvement in the running of events.

A P+F organisational group that is ultimately always planning ahead, watching the events' calendar and encouraging new teams of leaders for each grade-specific event

A P+F organisation group that is ready to spring to action and respond to family and wider community needs

A P+F organisation group of members who can liaise feely with the principal and the School Advisory Council regarding 'engagement' and general school/community matters

A P+F organisation group of members who can build a file/folder of resources, re events etc, to support a really smooth and easier 2020

A P+F organisation group that can support the managers of canteen, school uniform shop, school banking, book club etc

A P+F organisation group that links in with the Diocesan Parents' Association where relevant

<u>Swimming Lessons (Kinder-Year 4)</u> All K-4 classes have now received the swimming permission notes back from parents and the swimming school (Fitness first) are organising the coaches and support team. Between now and next week there are some very important things to get organised (especially for the younger students):

- 1. Label all items of your child's clothing school uniform, swimming costume, goggles, swimming cap, shoes, socks, underwear, spare clothes, towel, swimming bag
- 2. Have swimming bags packed the night before to prevent anything being forgotten
- 3. Ensure your child can get in and out of their own swimming costume independently
- 4. Ensure your child can put their own school uniform on independently

<u>Reminder</u>: All children wear their swimming costumes to school under their sports uniform. If you child has swimming at 9.15am, they wear their swimming costume under their 'pool clothes' and wear a pair of thongs / sandals to school. 'Pool clothes' may include an easy summer dress, t-shirt and shorts, a wearable hooded towel.

Swimming carnival: In the next couple of weeks families will be receiving permission notes for the school swimming carnival on Thursday 6th December. When these notes are sent home, it is vital that all necessary notes and information are returned to the school by the due date. Thanking you in advance.

Pastoral Care—Mr Sam McClean

As you may be aware, the Catholic Church across Australia is to have a Plenary Council in 2020, known as Plenary 2020.

A Plenary Council is the highest formal gathering of all local churches in a country. Our Plenary Council 2020 is being held so that we can have dialogue about the future of the Catholic Church in Australia.

The last time the Catholic Church in Australia held a Plenary Council was in 1937. It has been more than 80 years since we gathered all of the Church together and much has changed. In 2020, we will have a Plenary Council about the future of the Catholic Church in Australia. What are we called to do? Who are we called to be? How do we need to change?

Pope Francis has spoken of the need to engage in the world and respond in faith. He said:

"Our previous ways of explaining the world and relationships, good and bad, no longer appears to work. The way in which we locate ourselves in history has changed. Things we thought would never happen, or that we never thought we would see, we are experiencing now, and we dare not even imagine the future. That which appeared normal to us – family, the Church, society and the world – will probably no longer seem that way. We cannot simply wait for what we are experiencing to pass, under the illusion that things will return to being how they were before."

The journey toward the Plenary Council will help us to prepare to listen to God by listening to one another. We invite all people to engage, to be a part of the listening and dialogue encounter in the next two years.

The key question asked in in the run up to the plenary council is:

"What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

We are asked to come together and share dialogue about how each of us answer this question. If many people respond to this call, the Plenary Council will have much information to work from. There is no 'prerequisite' to have your say. The Plenary Council wants to hear from everyone. From those who attend Mass and are active in the Church, to those who are not as familiar with their Parish as perhaps they used to be.

At Our Lady of Dolours Catholic School, we will have the opportunity to come together to share our understandings of the key question "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?" *There will be a listening and dialogue session in the school library at 6pm sharp on Tuesday 6th of November – right before the Parents and Friends AGM.*

DIOCESE OF BROKEN BAY SPORTS COUNCIL SUMMER SPORTS SELECTION TRIALS 2018/19 INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Selection trials for students to attend the NSWCPS Polding Team Sport Selection Trials for basketball, tennis and cricket in Lismore (8 Feb 2019) will be held during term 4 this year (2018 –details below).

Any students wishing to be considered to attend a sport trial must return the 'Player Profile' to school NO LATER THAN FRIDAY 9 November. Please direct all enquiries to your school sport coordinator.

- Each school will then determine the students to be invited to attend the trial according to their experience/ability and in keeping with the entry limits and will confirm a student's permission to attend a sports trial by returning the 'Invitation to attend Broken Bay Sport Trial' to the student.
- A \$10 entry fee applies to all trials. Payment is to be made by Qkr (Instructions for payment
 process included with 'Invitation to attend'). This payment must be made no later than the day prior
 to the trial.
- Each student attending a trial must bring the 'Invitation to Attend' and give it to the Trial Convener upon arrival. The school will also have notified the convener of endorsed entries.
- Students are required to wear their school sport shirt to all trials.
- Parents are responsible for transport and supervision of their children at all Broken Bay trials.
 Parents are expected to remain with their child for the duration of the trial and to abide by the Broken Bay Diocese Code of Conduct.
- Dogs are not permitted at school sport events.
- The selectors' decisions are final. Any enquiries must be directed to your school sport coordinator.
- Boys' cricket is particularly competitive and with many students already having been identified as representative standard in community programs.
- As girls' cricket is a developing sport, any girls who are competent at cricket or softball are encouraged
 to attend.
- For tennis, only children of a competent standard, who participate in regular competition and are able to score may attend. Low bounce balls will not be used; only regulation yellow balls.
- For boys and girls basketball only children who are highly competent may attend.
- In the case of <u>wet weather</u> schools will be advised by email of any postponement. There will be a recorded message on the Primary Sport Information Line 82507976

The aim of the NSWCPS Polding Area trial in Lismore is to select a primary school team to compete in the NSW PSSA State Carnival and to give individuals who display outstanding ability (ie 'rep' players) the opportunity to be considered for selection in the NSW PSSA state team. For information re PSSA events go to:

https://app.education.nsw.gov.au/sport/NSWPSSA A student who is not available to compete at the Polding trials in Lismore or the particular state carnival should not attend a Broken Bay trial.

Parents must make their own transport and accommodation arrangements for their child if selected to represent Broken Bay at the Polding trials in Lismore.

All teams are open age (8-13yrs) and it is expected that most children selected will be in year 6 or year 5 in 2019. Students turning 13 in the year of competition will be eligible for selection in a Polding team but will not be eligible for selection in a state team.




Code of Conduct for Parents, Carers and other Spectators Attending School Sporting Events

The following code of conduct provides a set of simple protocols for spectators to promote a safe and positive environment at all sporting events at school, cluster, diocesan, state and national level for everyone involved.

By accepting the standards of behaviour in the code, we model good sportsmanship to our students, provide opportunities for them to grow on the sports field and ensure that sporting occasions are positive experiences for all concerned.

I strongly recommend that parents, carers and other spectators adopt this code of conduct.



Peter Hamill Director of Schools

- Children are encouraged to participate in sport but should not be obliged to participate.
- It is preferable to focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Respect for the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion is central to the culture of sport.
- All participants and supporters are encouraged to familiarise themselves with any rules or guidelines (e.g. printed in the program or on notices at the venue) that apply to a particular event and abide by any such rules & guidelines.
- Children are encouraged always to play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Officials' decisions should be respected by both spectators and players.
- All participants and supporters are asked to show appreciation for coaches, officials and managers and maintain positive relationships by being courteous and constructive in all communication with them.
- Barracking may be enthusiastic but it should never be fanatical or designed to heckle, belittle
 or disturb opposing team members.
- The use of bad language or any other form of harassment of players (from the opposition or a school's team), coaches, officials, referees or other spectators is unacceptable.
- Ridiculing or yelling at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition is not appropriate.
- Verbal and physical abuse by players is unacceptable.
- School Sport Australia's policy of a smoke and alcohol free environment applies to all Broken Bay sporting events.
- The authority of coaches and managers should be respected and it is inappropriate to question or confront them at the sports venue or during training sessions in front of other spectators and players.


