#### St Pius X College Enrolments for Year 7 2023 (for Catholic boys presently in Year 3 at OLoD)

Parents are reminded about the special 'priority enrolment' privilege the OLoD school enjoys with St Pius X College that allows Catholic students at OLoD entry into Year 7. This privilege gives parents a clear choice to keep their child at OLoD School until the end of Year 6 allowing them to benefit from important leadership opportunities and a mired of pastoral and educational advantages.

In order to secure this 'priority enrolment' privilege, parents with Catholic boys presently in Year 3 at OLoD School must fill in an enrolment form at St Pius X College during the month of March this year. Details can be found on the St Pius X College website.

### St Pius X College Enrolments for Year 7 2021 (for Catholic boys presently in Year 5 at OLoD)

Similar to the conditions above, parents can also access the 'priority enrolment" privilege for OLoD families if they enrol their child in the month of March this year. However, because this is effectively a 'later enrolment' parents need to feel confident that St Pius X College will put a priority on their application, but they must also be aware that there is no guarantee of securing a place in Year 7 in 2021.

**Birthdays**: Children are invited to wear mufti clothes (play clothes) to celebrate their birthday. They will speak at morning assembly to introduce themselves to the school. Due to our regulations around food sharing (due to severe food allergies at the school) we ask that parents do not bring in edible treats for the children. **Please note this is a different arrangement than in the past**: Parents can purchase and bring in their own zooper-dooper style ice-blocks or icy-poles (no ice-cream) and the teachers will distribute them. You may bring in your ice-blocks frozen (clearly labelled with your child's name) or the school can freeze them for you – NB: It can take up to a week to freeze a whole bag/box of ice-blocks.
