The Principal's Piece

Yesterday, I spoke to all students about the Lenten period that we are presently immersed in as Christians. I talked about the power of 'symbols' in our lives, and I pointed out a few 'crosses' that we can see in our school; some were obvious crosses, but some were simply cross patterns in and around our playground. Essentially, I was just encouraging students to be aware and on the lookout for Lenten and Easter 'reminders' in our everyday life.

A bit of trivia: When I was studying to be a teacher in the mid-1980s, I had to do an assignment on signs and symbols of our Church; according to my research, I found out the three most recognisable symbols in our world back then were:

- #1 Christian cross
- #2 Shell Petrol
- #3 The 'golden arches' for the worlds' most successful restaurant chain!

I had a look on-line this week to discover things have changed a bit ... The Apple logo and the Nike tick are 'right up there'!

I challenge all parents and friends to look out for 'crosses' throughout the rest of Lent. You might see them in tile patterns or even in tree branches!

Meeting this evening, 19.3.19 – 6.30pm, regarding 'Transitioning from the Kindergarten Ball'

As per several notifications during this term, I am just reminding families about the meeting this evening (<u>Tuesday 19 March</u>, <u>6.30pm</u>) regarding 'Transitioning from the Kindergarten Ball at OLD'.

This is a meeting for any parents who might be keen to hear me talk about, and lead a discussion, regarding the reasons why we need to 'transition' to a more contemporary and more inclusive arrangement for Kindergarten students within the Annual OLD Creative Arts Festival.

Following are some of the matters that will be addressed: (Please note that these matters were presented at the Term 1 P+F General Meeting earlier this term)

- NESA (NSW Education Standards Authority) Teaching and Learning Outcomes for Kindergarten Creative Arts/PD/H/PE will be better achieved when Kindergarten classes work within the framework that classes Yrs 1-6 have been using for many years
- The gender stereotyping ... particularly regarding the outdated and questionable way 6 year old boys 'present' their female partners. Essentially it is time for OLD to promote healthier social/emotional development
- The stress on some of the students (mainly some of the boys) who simply do not enjoy the extensive and repetitive debut practice sessions
 - The expense to some families
- The stress on the presentation night for 6 year olds who have to contend with a 2 hours session of photos prior to the event

To sum up, the new way forward will ensure inclusion of Kindergarten more fully in the Annual Creative Arts Festival (CAF) ... Indeed, the anticipated theme for 2019's CAF is around our school vision, "Ignite, Innovate and Include in Mercy".

Wellbeing week During Week 7 of each Term, the school celebrates and acknowledges our Wellbeing through Wellbeing Week. Last week the students had many opportunities to take care of their social, physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing through the range of activities offered. We had buddy reading (where children read with another class in the school), lunchtime handball comps with the teachers, funky sock day, special Wellbeing Lessons in class and Anti-bullying Day on Friday. We even did an evaluation drill to make sure our physical wellbeing is always safe and looked after at school. A really special feature of Wellbeing Week (which was led by our Year 6 students) was the midday mindfulness reminders. Every day at midday a child in each class dings the mediation bowl (our meditation bowls are so beautiful and are used in each classroom during soul journal and prayer time) which symbolises 30 seconds for the students to be still, silent and reflective of their day. Our Year 6 leaders did a great job in reminding classes to do this each day during Wellbeing Week which resulted in a beautiful sense of calm descend over the whole school.

<u>NAPLAN online</u> on Monday evening I held a meeting for Year 3 and 5 parents to learn about NAPLAN and the changes for the online assessment this year. This was streamed live on our Facebook page and all parents are welcome to watch this meeting if you would like to learn more about these assessments.

Robotics at OLD Next Wednesday afternoon the teachers will be participating in a Professional Learning session run by Mr Ledlin (our Eddisons guru) to learn about our new robotic equipment. These machines are called Eddisons and they are part of the lego family, which has huge advantages for learning. These robots can be coded by the students to conduct a range of things (which I will learn more about next Wednesday too!). However, they can be built upon to create new machines that can solve real life problems that the children will face in the Science and Technology programs (and other curriculum areas).



<u>National Anti-Bullying Day</u> Last Friday the students had lessons about Anti-Bullying. These would have covered some of the following topics: What is Bullying? What are the types of bullying? What do I do if I think I am being bullied? What do I do if I see someone being bullied?

You may wish to print off the attached poster to display in your house.

On Monday the students were given a little card to keep with them with tips to help them if they see or hear bullying or are being bullied. You may like to continue this conversation at home. The Government website has some great resources: https://bullyingnoway.gov.au/NationalDay

123 Magic On Wednesday morning (20th March 9-11am) we will be hosting our first session of 123 Magic. This parenting course is a great way to learn some really effective strategies and to hear stories from other parents to develop a network of support. For those who haven't registered yet please see the ladies in the office or email the school for registration details. The second session is Wednesday 27th March (participants need to attend both sessions).

<u>Little Athletics Program</u> This Friday the students commence their first lesson with professional coaches from Little Athletics NSW. The infant classes will be having their lesson at school and the primary classes will be walking up to Beauchamp Park. The program covers skills such as sprinting, relays, high jump, discuss and modified javelin. We thank our P&F who are funding this 10 week program to improve student skill, increase student participation in sporting events and prepare them for the Athletics carnival in Term 3.



<u>Little Athletics Parent Helpers:</u> On Friday we require some helpers to walk the primary classes up and back from the park (this is the only week we need parent helpers). We require at least two adults to

be with the students (parent helper and classroom teacher). There may even be someone out there who wants to ensure they get their steps up and walk and back all day!!! Even if your child isn't in the class, if you are able to help please email the school office. Thank you in advance!

Sacramental Program- Attention Year 2-6 Parents

In our Diocese, the 'Children's Sacramental Program' is a three-stage process through which children are prepared for Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

Confirmation is the first Sacrament after Baptism. Children need to be **7 years of age or older** to join the program (which is normally Year 2). Confirmation preparation will begin in Term 2 but to prepare for this, the parish is holding a Parent Meeting beforehand to explain the **whole program** including Confirmation, First Reconciliation and Holy Communion. We strongly recommend parents who are new to the sacramental program attend this meeting. **The meeting will be in the Church on Wednesday 10th April at 7pm.**

Opening a Conversation about People Seeking Asylum

Since the beginning of 2015, the Sydney Alliance has been running a campaign to change the conversation about people seeking asylum inside our partner organisations. The purpose of this campaign is to address the polarization around this issue by giving members of civil society organisations an opportunity to engage with the real stories of asylum seekers and to build relationships with them by meeting them face to face in a safe space inside their organisation.

More than 4000 people have already been touched by this campaign, including more than 2500 people who have participated in table talks in faith communities including parishes and schools (and others who have heard asylum seekers' stories at mass and other meetings).

This campaign has been made possible by the financial contributions of the Vinnies NSW, the Catholic Diocese of Parramatta and Settlement Services International, among others. It is staffed by a part time Community Organiser and led by volunteers from a range of Sydney Alliance partner organisations.

What is involved?

The main activity is the "table talk" – a conversation inside a local community about and with people seeking asylum. Table talks take between 90 minutes and 2.5 hours. They emphasise respectful dialogue and mutual sharing of personal stories around values that are important to us. At each gathering asylum seekers are invited to share their story. Members also share their stories and to ask questions of an expert. The goal is to build solidarity, to find common ground in our shared values, and build the capacity of our organisations to stand with people seeking asylum.

The Sydney Alliance provides the following to participating organisations

- One or more asylum seekers / refugees who are prepared to share their story during table talks
- A suggested format for the conversation (with a focus on sharing stories and values).
- An expert to respond to participants' questions and reflections
- Someone to facilitate, or co-facilitate with a local leader if desired.

Participating organisations are asked to:

- Provide a venue and time to gather for the table talk
- Turn out members to take part in the table talk
- Meet at least twice with Sydney Alliance leaders beforehand to adapt the agenda to their community and values, and at least once afterwards for debriefing and follow up
- Identify and bring together a small group of leaders willing to run small groups at the table talk (with training and support from the Sydney Alliance).


