Tuesday morning (today) was a hive of excitement as the students marvelled at, and played on, the new additions around the school.

Thank you to the bevy of workers on site for most of the holiday break, and thank you to Mr David Gale (OLD's maintenance man) for overseeing the myriad of work. I also note that David was the one who championed the design and construction of "Steve's Creek".

Students (and staff) are now enjoying:

A new mini basketball/volleyball court area

Shade sails over the new basketball/volleyball area

Repair in a couple of areas of the existing main playground shade sails

Synthetic grass over/on the new basketball/volleyball area - (including line marking)

Synthetic grass (off-cuts only) in the Growers' Garden

New bubblers throughout the playground - (and yes, there's now a bubbler system in the infants' area!)

Misting system – as per Steve's idea - (to be used when the weather gets warmer)

Pump and small 'stream' – "Steve's Creek" - (includes a water recycling system for the pump, and a rainwater collection tank) - to be completed over the next week

Substantial painting inside the school and also parts of the school exterior – (the school entrance foyer is now looking fresh and smart too)

Completion of the 'doors' mural in the undercroft

I draw parents and friends attention to the important safety matter following:

Slow down to 40 when bus lights flash

Public awareness campaign - Communications toolkit

About

NSW has one of the largest bus fleets in Australia. More than 3850 buses operate in the Sydney area, while another 1000 buses service the Newcastle, Wollongong and Blue Mountains areas. In addition, more than 3000 bus services operate in rural and regional NSW.

The NSW Government is committed to working with industry and the community to improve safety around buses and is implementing a campaign targeting motorists to highlight the laws around bus flashing lights.

The issue

Research commissioned by the Centre for Road Safety highlighted a need to improve motorists' awareness of, and compliance with, road rules around bus flashing lights. Lights flash on the front and back of a bus when the bus is picking up or setting down school children. By law you must slow down to 40km/h when bus lights flash.

Research and scientific analysis shows that a pedestrian hit by a car travelling at 40km/h has twice the chance of surviving the collision than if the car was travelling at 50km/h. Speeds higher than 40km/h greatly increases the risk of injury and death to pedestrians in the event of a crash.

The campaign

Since July 2018, the schools zones public awareness campaign, run by Transport for NSW at the start of each school term, has been extended to include additional messaging around bus flashing lights.

The campaign runs for a week from **Sunday 21 July – Friday 26 July 2019** for the start of Term 3 and comprises:

- Radio and social media advertising
- Promotion on screens in all 101 Service NSW centres across the State
- Variable Message Signs (VMS) on certain roads
- Content for partners to use and share.

Something astonishing happened in the holidays for Adrian – Year 6:

Dear Mr Ledlin,

Here is what I did in the holidays at the Rubik's Cube World Championship.

This Competition was called Rubik's Presents WCA World Championship. The WCA or the World Cube Association is a non-profit organisation in charge of all the cubing competitions.

On the 10th of July my family and I flew to Melbourne for the Rubik's Cube World Championships, starting on the 11th of July and ending on the 14th. Of the 18 WCA events, I competed in five which were 2x2 Cube, 3x3 Cube, 3x3 Cube using one-hand, Pyraminx and Skewb.

In Cubing Competitions you do five solves and your best and worst are taken out, and the middle three solves are averaged - (results following are in seconds):

In 2x2, in times (seconds), I achieved were 4.32, 4.84, 7.81, 3.88 which was the personal best and a 6.28 which was a 5.15 average, a personal best average for me too!

For 3x3, the solves I achieved were a 15.53, a DNF which stands for did not finish, a 16.02, a 10.72 and a 13.33 which is a 14.96 average.

For 3x3 one-handed the solves, I achieved were 23.63, 29.80, 35.94, 23.46, 20.84 which is a personal best leading to a personal best average of 25.63.

For Pyraminx, I didn't achieve my best times – I achieved a 13.52 and a 10.53 and only did two solves because none of the first two solves were under ten seconds.

For Skewb, I didn't make the cut-off of ten seconds which the times I achieved were 10.38 and 14.53

To conclude, I felt that this competition was amazing, and I am extremely happy with my times for most off my events. I reached most of my goals for all events and I definitely want to go to the World Championship again in 2020.

Cambodia update: Thank you to everyone who so generously shopped at my 'Cambodia stall' during the last couple of weeks in Term 2. Over the holidays I got the really fun job of spending the money!! I was able to buy 22 high quality and durable ceiling fans for the school, which means each classroom will now have one and over 100 new picture books for the school library. Over the past 6 months the school library has had such a dramatic transformation thanks to the generosity and compassion of our school community – overall, over 300 new books have been purchased, more than tripling the library's size. The fans were a really important purchase as the school did not previously have electricity and students all ride their bikes a long distance to school. So after a long bike ride, the children then sit in a classroom with 50 other students without any electricity in over 40 degree heat. Each morning I walk to school and visit the classrooms and I still cannot imagine what it must be like to try and teach or learn in this stifling and exhaustive heat. So, I hope you all know how very much you are appreciated and loved by the entire village of Krang Lovea, in rural Cambodia!










REC— Miss Camilla Brown
