The Principal's Piece

Reflection on this coming weekend's gospel (Luke 12:13-21) by Sr Hildegard:

"This coming weekend's Gospel is more than an indictment of wanton consumerism; it's a challenge to consider how we use things, the value we place on 'stuff'.

Often a thing's true worth has nothing to do with its monetary value — a particular thing's value is how we can use it to realize and express the love of God in our midst. Jesus calls us to take inventory of our lives and the things that 'clutter' them and refocus on the treasures of God: compassion, mercy, forgiveness, peace.

Jesus's parable of the rich man's barns is an invitation to make 'winnowing' of our possessions not just a practical task as we move from one stage our lives to the next, but a spiritual exercise of 'freeing' ourselves of things in order to centre, with gratitude and humility, on the true things of worth in our lives."
