Throughout the first two weeks of this term I have been extremely fortunate to participate in 4 days of professional learning in Mathematics. These days have been so valuable for me as a learner and as a leader. The Professional Learning days have provided myself and other teachers an opportunity to reflect on our current teaching and leadership strategies and learn more about best practise in Mathematics. There has been a really big shift both, in our Diocese and internationally, to structure Maths lessons so that students not only deepen their conceptual understanding of Maths but also develop the essential life skills of creativity, critical thinking, resilience, perseverance, flexibility and enjoyment of Maths. We want our students to be confident, numerate citizens who can examine and question the world around them, while making connections and challenging themselves. ## <u>Parent Education Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November 6.30 – 7.30pm – Numeracy and the EPMC</u> <u>Project</u>

I would like to invite all parents to attend a special Parent Education session about a new project we have been doing in Maths this year called EPMC – Encouraging Persistence Maintaining Challenge. During the 1 hour session myself and the Year 1 teachers will be telling you about the program, demonstrating the lesson style and describing the amazing impact it has had on the Year 1 students (who have been the focus of this year's project). We are currently trailing the teaching style of EPMC in other classes but are hoping to implement it in all classrooms in 2020. This program is not just about increasing academic gains but also developing the essential learning skills of creative problem solving, resilience, independence, persistence, deep and critical thinking, flexibility and reasoning and justification. So come along and learn about a new way that Maths is being explored by the students!

# **ACTING PRINCIPAL—Miss Kirsty Thorpe**

PAT tests; Reading and writing (Year 1-6) Next week all students in Year 1-6 will be sitting two online tests called 'PAT' assessments (Progressive Achievement Assessment). These tests are conducted every year and are created by Australian Council for Educational Research. These tests are assessment tools to help teachers analysis student understanding in Mathematics and English and track their growth from year to year. The teachers use this data to program lessons that cater for the students' needs and triangulate data from other assessments, including NAPLAN, MAIs and in class work. We also use the data to track school trends and patterns. For Year 1 and 2, the tests are a great way for students to practise using the ICLT devices with buddies from an older grade. 'PAT' tests are for the school and teachers usage, therefore parents will not receive any results but if you are ever concerned about your child's progress or leaning you can make appointments to meet with your class teacher.

# 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday: A parable to Ponder

# Stay up to date with Opal and ticketing changes for school travel

# 2020 school travel applications now open



To assist with any enquiries you may receive regarding student travel applications, we have provided some information below.

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address

have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.
