Throughout the year, the hardworking Grants Team (Katie Crichton, Holly Treder and Michelle Stanley) were successful in receiving a \$38 000 grant to improve our playground.

- The ANZAC memorial
- The new modern bubblers
- The new native bee hive in the Grower's Corner
- The wooden play areas behind the play equipment and the shop near the library
- The new grassed area which is our volleyball/ basketball court including the shade cloth and basketball hoops
- The great water pump and water play area inspired by and dedicated to Mr MacDonald.

Bunnings BBQ Another amazing community event was the Bunnings BBQ and cake stall last Saturday. Thank you to the P&F for organising this opportunity and all the helpers needed. Thank you to everyone who volunteered their time to help on the day, made cakes (I sampled quite a few and they were delicious!) and donated their time to buy the supplies. It was not only a successful fundraising event but more importantly, a wonderful opportunity be build our community spirit.

<u>Kindy 2020 Orientation program</u> This morning we held our first orientation session for our 2020 Kindergarten students. We are so fortunate to have two full classes of excited (but nervous and slightly overwhelmed) children ready to start OLD next year. DIOCESE OF BROKEN BAY SPORTS COUNCIL SUMMER SPORTS SELECTION TRIALS 2019/20 INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Selection trials for students to represent Broken Bay at the NSWCPS Polding Team Sport Selection Trials for basketball and tennis in Lismore (7 Feb 2020) will be held during term 4 this year (2019 – details below). Note that Broken Bay cricket and softball trials will be held in 2020.

Any students wishing to be considered to attend a sport trial must return the 'Player Profile' to school NO LATER THAN FRIDAY 8 November. Please direct all enquiries to your school sport coordinator.

- Each school will then determine the students to be invited to attend the trial according to their
 experience/ability and in keeping with the entry limits and will confirm a student's permission to attend a
 sports trial by returning the 'Invitation to attend Broken Bay Sport Trial' to the student.
- A \$10 entry fee applies to all trials. This payment must be made using Qkr (Instructions for payment process included with 'Invitation to attend') no later than the day prior to the trial.
- Each student attending a trial must bring the 'Invitation to Attend' and give it to the Trial Convener upon arrival. The school will also have notified the convener of endorsed entries.
- Students are required to wear their school sport shirt to all trials.
- Parents are responsible for transport and supervision of their children at all Broken Bay trials.
 Parents are required to remain with their child for the duration of the trial and to abide by the Broken Bay Diocese Code of Conduct.
- · No Dogs are permitted to be at school sport events.
- The selectors' decisions are final. Any enquiries must be directed to your school sport coordinator.
- For tennis, only children of a competent standard, who participate in regular competition may attend.
 Yellow balls will be used; no low bounce. Players are expected to be able to score and 'self-umpire' competently. A school may not nominate more than 3 boys and 3 girls.
- For boys and girls basketball only children who are highly competent may attend.
- In the case of wet weather schools will be advised by email of any postponement. There will be a recorded message on the Primary Sport Information Line 82507976
- The aim of the NSWCPS Polding Area trial in Lismore is to select a primary school team to compete in the NSW PSSA State Carnival and to give individuals who display outstanding ability (ie 'rep' players) the opportunity to be considered for selection in the NSW PSSA state team. For information re PSSA events go to: https://app.education.nsw.gov.au/sport/NSWPSSA
- A student who is not available to compete at the Polding trials in Lismore or the particular state carnival should not attend a Broken Bay trial.
- Parents must make their own transport and accommodation arrangements for their child if selected to represent Broken Bay at the Polding trials in Lismore.
- All teams are open age (8-13yrs) and it is expected that most children selected will be in year 6 or year 5 in 2020. Students turning 13 in the year of competition will be eligible for selection in a Polding team but will not be eligible for selection in a state team.

School Travel

Stay up to date with Opal and ticketing changes for school travel

2020 school travel applications now open



To assist with any enquiries you may receive regarding student travel applications, we have provided some information below.

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address

have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.
