

<u>Safety at OLD regarding Nuts/Nut Products and Eggs/Egg Products:</u> Several students at OLD can have a serious, life threatening allergic reaction to Nuts/Nut Products and Eggs/Egg Products. Because of this, we strenuously ask all families to not send Nuts/Nut Products and Eggs/Egg Products to school in your children's lunches. Thank you for your anticipated support of this critical matter.

<u>Internet Agreements and various permission notes:</u> Parents are reminded to return Internet Agreement sheets and all other permission notes to school as soon as possible.

1, 2, 3, Magic Parenting Course For the fourth year running we are offering the wonderful parenting course called '1, 2, 3 Magic'. This is an extremely helpful and practical course that we encourage parents to attend. Please refer to the flyer at the end of this newsletter.

<u>Library helpers:</u> Throughout Term 1, Miss Eliza Scott-Fell will be our library teacher on Tuesday and Wednesday and Mrs Lauren Montgomery will be assisting with some administration time on a Monday afternoon. Throughout the term we require some assistance from parents shelving books and contacting books (which can be done at home or in the library). If you're able to assist in anyway please contact the school - we can accommodate your available times and the amount you are able to help. Thank you in advance.

Students will not be borrowing books for the next two weeks (Week 2 or 3) as we are sorting through all our books to ensure we have the highest quality, up-to-date books in our library.

<u>Compass 2020:</u> Every parent must enter their child's absence before 9am. If your child is marked 'Not Present' by the teacher (rolls are marked by 9am) and you have not entered the absence, a notification will be sent to you informing you that your child is not at school. You will need to add the absence as soon as possible. You will also receive an email to remind you to enter the absence reason within 7 days. *Remember, every school day is important for your child's social, emotional and academic development.*

<u>MAI Assessments and Best Start:</u> Thank you to everyone for bringing in your child/ren for the MAI or Best Start (Kindy) assessment. For those who didn't get an appointment all other assessments will be done in class time.

The MAI is a diagnostic assessment that involves the teacher conducting a 1:1 Mathematics interview with each child. The MAI assessments allow us to ascertain a starting point for the children in four areas of Maths (Counting, Place Value, Addition and Subtraction and Multiplication and Division). The Kindy Best Start assessments inform the teachers of your child's current abilities in Literacy (reading and writing).

Each of these number concepts are described in a series of Growth points. Growth points are like stepping stones along the path to Mathematical understanding'. These growth points are imperative in helping teachers understanding how children learn, assessing where a child's understanding is at in order to plan teaching that meets the students' next 'point of need'. Growth points also assist us in identifying children who are at risk in their learning or who have gaps in their mathematical understanding.

Each teacher analyses the results from the MAIs and programs their lessons according to the needs of every child. The MAIs allow us to differentiate our teaching so every child is being catered for and challenged to their full potential. As a school we also analyse the data to identify the needs of whole grades or areas that the school excel in. The data gives school leadership a really clear picture of where to go in the future relating to Maths and our own Professional Learning as teachers. We have seen some really exciting improvements across the school over the past few years of conducting these assessments and look forward to continued improvements for all students.

Open morning - come and observe a lesson! Monday 2nd March; 9am-10.15am: This year we will be opening up our classrooms for parents to observe a lesson and each term you will be able to observe a different subject in your child's classroom. These open mornings will commence with a short learning opportunity where I will be explaining what you will see and hear in the classrooms and why these things occur. We will then gather afterwards for a questions session (about topics not individual students). We understand it may be disappointing for some parents who are unable to make the chosen date and time but they will be changed each term to try to accommodate as many parents as possible.

Please note, that we ask that you respect the teacher and all the students during these sessions - no photos or videos to be taken, no interaction with students or teachers (other than a little wave. We want them to be focused on their learning), and 100% confidentiality with what you see and hear - no comparisons to be made or discussing other students academic development.

Home Learning 2020:, Years 1-6 will be using Google Classrooms to communicate their home learning. Some grades will only use Google Classroom (tasks will be posted on here and handed in using the online forum). Other grades will continue to use a home learning book but will post weekly tasks or instructions on the Google Classroom too. If your child does not have their home learning (or if they lose it), you can simply log onto the grade's Google Classroom and retrieve it. *Please see your classroom teacher if you have any questions.*

<u>Communicating with teachers</u>: A reminder that all parents must email teachers via the school email which gets forwarded to each teacher. A teacher is unable to reply to emails or phone calls during school time, as their main priority is the education of your children and every teacher has a duty of care for their students. *If a message is urgent please ring the school and this message will be communicated to teachers immediately.*

We ask that you do not try to meet with teachers once the bell has gone and they are walking their class to the classroom or when they are in class. A teacher has a duty of care to their students and all their attention must be with these students. We must respect this duty of care. If you have an urgent message for the teacher, please email/call/see the office.

<u>Parent Education – Mathematics</u>: I will again be offering the 3 session Parent Education course on Mathematics and Numeracy at OLD. These sessions will introduce parents to how and why we teach Maths at OLD, you will walk away with a variety of games to play with children and a deeper understanding of the syllabus that we teach. If you attended the sessions last year, you will not need to attend again.

The session dates are: Tuesday 3rd March, Monday 10th March, Monday 16th March 6.30-7.30pm (held in the school library) If you would like to attend please email the school office before Friday 28th February.

Learning Every Day Counts



Absences add up!

Being 10 minutes late per day can lead to 6 days missed per year.



Missing 2 days of school a month means over 1 entire year of missed learning in a child's school life.



Each day missed:

- Puts your child behind and makes it harder for them to catch up.
- Can lead to lower achievement in reading, writing and numeracy.
- Can lead to gaps in learning and impact on social and emotional skills.



Good habits begin early

Be on time each and every day.



Good attendance starts in Kindergarten and sets your child up for success in school life.

What parents can do

- Be firm. Send your child to school every day unless they are sick
- Develop good sleep and morning routines
- Schedule appointments after school
- Avoid taking holidays during term time
- Limit screen time



<u>Welcome</u>! May I take the opportunity to personally welcome all our families back for another school year. A particularly warm 'hello' to our new students and families- we are excited to welcome you to our school community! Our teaching staff have been working hard during the holidays to get ready for their new students and are all really excited to get to know your children and progress them in their academic journey.

2019 'Welcome Back To School' Reminders:

- **Uniform**: Please ensure all uniforms are neat and tidy each day. Hats are a compulsory part of the uniform and must be worn by students every morning when they arrive at school as well as every time the students go outside (recess, lunch, sport lessons, outdoor lessons). Girls must wear hair accessories of school colours only (on sport days they may wear their colour house colours). Nail polish and colored scrunchies are not permitted (keep it as a holiday treat!).
- <u>Punctuality</u>: A reminder that school begins at 8.45am it is very important that children arrive before this time so they are settled with their class at assembly. Arriving after the bell causes your child to have a disruptive start to the day which often causes children to become worried or anxious about the day ahead. Anyone arriving after assembly **must** walk their child to the front office to sign into COMPASS. And finally, supervision will not start until 8.15am, please do not arrive before 8.15am.
- <u>Lost property</u>: PLEASE label every item of clothing and equipment your child brings to school clearly with their name. We really want the children to learn responsibility for their belongings and also not waste your money by losing items that you've bought! With an environmental focus this year, the amount of uniform landfill that piles up weekly can be horrifying. We are aiming for no lost property and are aiming to remove lost property baskets.
- Overarching school rules: Our PBL (Positive Behaviours for Learning) rules at OLD are: Be Responsible; Be Respectful; Be Safe; Be a Good Learner.
- **Summer Heat:** We encourage all students to bring a drink bottle to school and wear sunscreen. The school is not permitted to apply sunscreen on children but if they know.
