<u>Preparing for 2021</u>: Over the coming weeks, teachers will be carefully and strategically ensuring classes K-5 are divided evenly and fairly to ensure the best possible outcomes for students' social, emotional and academic development in 2021. I respectfully ask parents not to request teachers for their children and not to request placement with specific students in a specific class.

I cannot stress to parents more strongly that the collective wisdom of the school staff is what best divides the classes in the fairest and best way possible. Even moving just one child from one class to another can upset the balance.

<u>Semester 2 Students Reports will be available to parents on the Compass portal on Friday 11th December.</u> Please ensure you print all your reports from COMPASS if you are leaving OLD at the end of 2020 as you will no longer have access to COMPASS after 16 December 2020.

<u>Year 5 Leadership program</u>: We are coming up to some very exciting weeks for our Year 5 students as they apply for leadership roles for 2021. Next Wednesday we will hear speeches from the students applying for school captain and the following week, we will hear from the students applying for sports captains. We have a great leadership program, whereby all students are part of a leadership team - Environment, ICLT, Mercy/Liturgy, Creative Arts, Library or Sports Leaders. We will announce our 2021 Leaders to the school community in the Week 9 newsletter.

Parent Information Session: The MAI assessment: Monday 30th November; 6-7pm (Via zoom), I will be holding an information session to explain the MAI assessment. The MAI (Mathematical Assessment Instrument) is a one-on-one assessment that ALL children will participate in on the first day of the 2021 school year (as they have done so for the past 8 years at OLD). During this session I will explain the purpose of this assessment; what kind of data it provides teachers and the school; what the assessment is teaching us about your children; how teachers use the data. This is a very important assessment as it does not inform us of how fast your child can recite Mathematical facts, such as their times tables, but what strategies they use to problem solve. Please email the school to register for this session and receive the zoom link.

HATS! HATS! HATS! As we are now in November it is so important that EVERY student at O.L.D. is wearing their hat every day. Not only is the hat an important part of the school uniform, but it is also extremely important for skin safety. Please ensure your child is wearing their hat in the morning when they come to school as well as when they are walking home in the afternoon. It is compulsory for students to wear their hat at recess, lunch, during sport lessons or during any outdoor lessons. If a child is not wearing their hat they will need to sit in the shade. Please assist the school by checking your child has their hat packed every day. Thank you!

Library books and Home Readers: Can everyone please check if they have any school library books or home readers in their bookshelves at home and return them to school ASAP. We have invested a lot of school funds into the beautiful books that your children read but if they go missing our resources will dwindle. When classes have their daily Guided Reading lessons the teachers use a set of 6 books to read with the students – if one of these books are missing, the set is no longer usable. DOUBLE PARKING

Do not double park at any time. Double parking is liegal and dangerous especially around schools. It reduces visibility and blocks the road for other motor

U TURNS

- · Performing U turns or 3 point turns in
- school zones is extremely dangerous. Performing U turns across unbroken centre lines is lilegal and is particularly dangerous around schools



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PARKING / STOPPING NEAR INTERSECTIONS

It is llegal to park or stop less than 10 metres from an intersection with no traffic lights as this blocks visibility for turning drivers and creates a hazard for all motorists.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS AND CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS

- Slow down as you approach pedestrian crossings and children's crossings.
- · Do not proceed if the road beyond
- the crossing is blocked.
- Do not stop or park in the No Stopping zones on either side this blocks visibility. r side of the crossing as
- At a children's crossing you must stop at or before the stop line if there is a pedestrian about to cross or already on the crossing.
- . Do not proceed through a children's crossing until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.

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HOLDING HANDS IN TRAFFIC

- Children need assistance in the traffic environment until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe.
- All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles, footpaths, shared paths, driveways car parks, at traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, on quiet streets and busy roads
- Make sure you always set a good example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for. Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why.
- Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your child holds onto your bag, pram or even your arm or sloeve.



School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021. Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
