In your companionship with us, may we find the courage to continue to make decisions for faith and for love. May we hear the murmur of hope in our hearts. Awaken in our hearts awareness of the suffering of others, especially to those nearest to us. As we allow ourselves to be touched by the pain of others, stir within us the desire to be a companion to others in their needs. Inspire us to always act with creative courageous compassion."
