Schools are there to help

Student attendance at school is a shared commitment by students, families, schools and the community. It is important that students attend every day and that time out of school is minimised as this can have a significant impact on learning and development especially with young children.

We ask for appointments for students are kept out of school time where possible to avoid a loss of learning time and that any regular appointments during school time to be approved by the Principal, such as speech therapy and Occupational therapy. A form is available at the school office to apply for this leave and you are asked to attach a letter from your treating practitioner to support this.





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In Stage 3 we are practising to read, order and represent numbers up to tens of millions including decimals! We have also been doing difficult word problems that challenge us to use division and multiplication strategies. The most fun activities include maths games like COMBO and the snake game. At OLD, we have a PBL Matrix where we learn about what makes us Safe, Respectful and Responsible Learners. You might have seen these words on the crayons at the front of our school. Each fortnight, we focus on one expectation for these rules.

This fortnight, our focus expectation is "We learn and let others learn"... We are life-long learners! This means we prioritise our learning through responsible learning behaviours such as active listening and trying our best. We respect our peer's learning and encourage them to do their best also! We embrace our learning journey with a positive attitude. We would love families to have a learning chat at home this week using probing questions such as "What do you love about learning?" ... "What can you do to be an even better learner?"

Premier's Reading Challenge

The PRC for 2023 opens next week for student entries. Last year we had an incredible number of children participate in and complete this reading challenge. The aim of this initiative is to support our children to enjoy their reading through selected quality literature. In order to complete the challenge, interested students must read a certain number of books from a predetermined list and then log these online. The number of books needed to be read depends on the student's grade level. More information about participating in this challenge and how to log on to the online site will be made available shortly. This will also be explained in Library sessions next week.













COMPASS is the main communication app for the school and where you will note student absences, find school reports and book meetings with teachers. In the case of a full day absence parents must enter their child's absence before 9am. If your child is marked 'not present' by the teacher and you have not entered an absence note you will be sent a notification informing you that your child is not at school. You will need to add the absence as soon as possible. You will also receive an email to remind you to enter the absence reason within 7 days. Remember, every school day is important for your child's social, emotional and academic development.



A reminder that all parents must email teachers via the school email (old@dbb.catholic.edu.au) this gets forwarded to each teacher. A teacher is unable to reply to emails or phone calls during school time, as their main priority is the education of your children and every teacher has a duty of care for their students. If a message is urgent please call the school office for the message to be communicated to the teacher as soon as possible
