The 8th of August was the Feast Day of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Australia's first saint. Born in Melbourne in 1842, Mary grew up in a small town in South Australia named Penola. In 1866, when Mary was in her 20s, Mary began a religious order named the Sisters of Saint Joseph. She and her sisters opened schools in isolated places and lived a life

dedicated to serving the uneducated and the poor.

Mary Mackillop taught us "Never see a need without doing something about it!"

The focus of the initiative was Mary Mac's Place, located on the Central Coast. Mary Mac's is a shelter open to anyone who is homeless, transient, or needing a helping hand. FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION 15 OF AUGUST























Creative Arts Festival




