Polding Swimming Championships

A big congratulations must go to Conor McLoughlin in Year 6 who represented our school with pride in last Wednesday's Polding Swimming Championships at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre.

Below is a recount of Conor's experience on the day.

On the 3rd of April, I went to the Polding Swimming Trials to compete to try and qualify for the Polding team. I arrived at the Sydney Olympic Aquatic Centre at around 9:00 am. My race started at 10:30am, so I had lots of time. About 30 minutes later, I went into the warm up pool to practice my dives, but every time I dived in, my goggles fell off. So my parents came up with an idea to put my swimming cap over my goggles. After I had practiced a few more dives, I started to get really nervous. Then I was called to marshalling to get ready for my race.

I was waiting for my race to start and I was so nervous, butterflies were flying all around my stomach. They told me that I was in Heat I out of 2. I waited about 30 minutes until my race started. Then I was called. I got up on the diving blocks, completely zoned in like nothing matters except the race. Then the buzzer sounded when I heard the "BEEP!". I knew to dive in. I went all out and came first in my heat.

I knew that only the top 3 out of 18 swimmers could qualify, so I swam as fast as I could. When the race was over, I saw that I had won my heat. I was really happy with myself because I came first and I got a time of 32.95 seconds, which beat my personal best by almost half a second. I came tenth overall out of 18 swimmers, so I didn't qualify for the polding team this time, but was really happy with myself for doing what I did.

Conor I must say, Mr. Caltabiano, your teachers, your peers, and the OLD Chatswood community are so proud of your achievement. You should be very thrilled with your effort on the day. Keep up the swimming and I know one day, we will see you in the Olympics, trying to win Australia Gold! Gooooooooooo Conor!
