


Advisory Council

At our Term 3 Advisory Council Meeting, we shared some important updates on the school's annual plan, enrolment, and promotions. Enrolment for 2024 and 2025 is looking strong, and orientation sessions are ready to go. A listening panel on secondary school options, part of the North Shore Review, was held on 5 September. This review aims to develop future plans and identify opportunities for growth and improvement in our systemic Catholic schools.

We're happy to report that the school musical was a big hit, and we're excited for the upcoming Christmas Festa later this year. Wellbeing programs are expanding, and resources including wellbeing and sensory kits, table tennis tables, and craft activities have been added. Additional reading resources have also been purchased, and planned renovations for the library and outdoor areas were carried out during the term break. Finally, a Parish Sacramental Retreat Day was held in Term 3, with positive feedback from parents about the new format. The half-day session was a success and focused on Blessed Carlo Acutis.

Blessed Carlo - our first Millennial Saint






Blessed Carlo has arrived in Chatswood! On the 11th October 2024 the night before Blessed Carlo's feast day - Our Lady of Dolours Church held a special celebration for the installation of Blessed Carlo's Relic in the new Chapel of Eucharistic Devotion. The church was filled with parishioners, school staff, several priests, and the angelic choir, creating a truly sacred atmosphere. Blessed Carlo will be canonised and become the first millennial saint in 2025 inspiring young people with his example of faith.

Bishop Anthony Randazzo announced that the Parish of Chatswood will become a Shrine of Hope and be a focal point when Blessed Carlo is canonised in 2025 Jubilee Year.


