## Life Skills Go



Here at OLD we are excited to be rolling out an exciting new well-being initiative called Life Skills Go. You may have already heard about it from your child? Children are now completing a quick daily emotion check in via an online portal. They are asked to select one of six options to reflect how they are feeling - happy, sad, calm, tired, worried or angry. They can also nominate where they are predominantly feeling this emotion - classroom, playground or home.

The purpose of Life Skills Go is to help students get familiar with emotional literacy and support learner needs. Teachers can then use this information to assess learner readiness and identify students that may need support.

Teachers are reporting so far that they love being able to see an instant snapshot of students' readiness to learn and whether any students are in need. This enables them to move into a preventative/proactive space by quickly identifying student emotions before they start the day and identify longitudinal patterns. - Chandra Kennedy




Our school captains accompanied Mr Ianni to the Chatswood Garden of Remembrance for the Remembrance Day ceremony, representing OLD with pride.
