



Premier's Reading Challenge

Over the past 2 weeks we have used morning assemblies to congratulate and recognise all our Premier's Reading Challenge award winners for 2024. There were so many participants from OLD this year we had to spread it across 2 weeks! How incredibly exciting to witness so many of our students so eager for reading this year. Across NSW, a record 323,328 students completed the Challenge this year. They read a combined total of 9,115,211 books - with this year's most read book being Bowerbird Blues by Aura Parker (the 2024 National Simultaneous Storytime book). Well done to our 85 students completing the challenge plus our Gold and Platinum certificate recipients. These students have completed the PRC for either 4 or 7 consecutive years. What an achievement!
