Broken Bay Netball Rep Trial

On Monday 7th April, Lillian.D from Year 5 represented Our Lady of Dolours, Chatswood at the Broken Bay Netball Representative Trial @ St Leo's College Wahroonga. There were over 65 students at the trial, & there was only 1 team of 8 to select from. Below is a recount of Lillian's experience on the day: On Monday 7th April, I attended the Netball Representative Trial for Broken Bay. When I arrived, the head of the rep trials wrote numbers on our thighs to distinguish players.

There were 10 games, and they put 28 students on at a time, 14 on one court. There were two centres, two goal keepers, two goal attacks, two goal defences, two wing attacks, two wing defences, and 2 goal shooters. They had two in each position, so there was always someone to defend you /try to stop you from getting the ball.

We had to play at least 3 games so the four judges who were choosing the team had time to look at everyone. There were 65 girls trying out and they were mainly Year 5s and at least 10 Year 6s. If you weren't playing that round, you would sit outside or inside to have a snack or watch the other girls play. The judges were only going to choose eight students for the next stage of the trial. After five games, there was a ten-minute break so the judges could discus. After the ten rounds, the trial finished, the judges told us we would find out via email. I then got picked up and headed back to school.

Mr. Caltabiano and the Chatswood community is very proud of Lillian for representing our school and giving it her best on the day. Although Lillian did not make it into the next stage, she still did a terrific effort. We wish Lillian all the best for the netball season ahead.

Polding Swimming Championships

A big congratulations must go to Julian.C in Year 5 who represented our school with pride in last Wednesday's Polding Swimming Championships at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre. Julian came 15th overall in the Boys 10yo 50m Freestyle beating his PB (Personal Best) with a time of 39.13.
