Visit to the Shrine of Blessed Carlos Acutis

Fr Hein led our students on a very special visit to the church, where they saw the shrine of Blessed Carlos Acutis. He spoke beautifully about what it means to be a saint – a friend of God. He explained that Carlos was a true friend of Jesus, someone who always spoke to Him and prayed with love and devotion. Fr Hein reminded us that we can all become saints too, by being friends of Jesus in our everyday lives.

Fr Hein showed the children the relic of Blessed Carlo's hair, presented in the shape of a cross inside a beautiful golden cross. The children were fascinated by this precious and sacred item.

Fr Hein also read the story of The Good Shepherd, helping the children understand that Jesus calls each of us by name and wants to be our friend.

We all sang together the hymn "Open My Eyes, Lord", and Fr Hein encouraged everyone to remember to open our eyes so we can see Jesus; to open our ears so we can hear Him, and to open our hearts so we can love Him more.

assistance in this program.














Parent Education Session #3 Mathematics

It turned out to be such a beautiful and enriching experience. Jana had the most amazing time exploring and learning about the pilgrim churches around our diocese. It was so heartwarming to see her curiosity and excitement grow with every visit.

One of the highlights of our pilgrimage was seeing the relics of Pope John Paul II. It felt extra special because I was just around Jana's age when he visited the Philippines. It brought back so many memories and made the experience even more touching for me personally.




