From the Advisory Council

At the recent meeting in Term 3, we received an update on the Diocese's five-year strategic plan, Shaping Tomorrow, Together in Faith, which continues to guide school planning across the region. While the wider review process has brought significant changes to some communities, including school amalgamations, OLD remains strong and stable. Exciting prospects lie ahead, including discussions around a new local coeducational high school and potential partnerships to secure high school pathways for students. Catholic Care will continue providing after-school care, and we are hopeful that they can reopen before-school care if the demand is there. The school continues to strengthen its community connections through initiatives such as preschool visits, the Willoughby Council Spring Fair, and a professional promotional video currently in production. OLD TV continues to be a hit with families, and there are plans to involve parents more in future episodes. Facilities and technology upgrades have enhanced learning spaces, while outdoor improvements and new wireless systems continue to modernize the campus. The meeting also covered canteen updates, parent education sessions, and next year's Creative Arts Festival. Staff were also celebrated for their impressive fundraising efforts in the City2Surf, contributing to a meaningful cause and strengthening community spirit.

Thank you to the parents that were able to join Rebecca for our November Parent Connect Corner.


